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A Tourist's Guide to The Land of the Loess Gorges

In the western part of the Lublin Upland, there lies the Land of Loess Gorges. Nine exceptional communes: **Janowiec, Kazimierz Dolny, Nałęczów, Opole Lubelskie, Poniatowa, Wąwolnica, Wojciechów, the town and The Commune of Puławy**, are home to kind and friendly people.

This Land, criss-crossed by a dense network of gorges, is the essence of Polishness. It tempts the visitor with the richness of national culture and nature heritage. Whoever visits it will not only come across mysterious ravines and gorges but also lush forests, gentle hills, and vast fields; the eye will be pleased by the scenic Valley of the Vistula. On the way the hikers can see:

- knight's castles shrouded in legend,
- manor houses which still hold memories of the educational passion of the Polish landowners,
- lordly mansions whose past residents had an enormous influence on shaping the national culture and, not uncommonly, European politics,
- the houses of illustrious artists who drew literary and artistic inspiration from this land,
- peasant cottages carefully protecting the material and spiritual culture of their environment, including unusual handicrafts.

Everyone who comes to this land will experience the real nature of the country on the Vistula.



JANOWIEC COMMUNE



Janowiec Commune – located on the bank of the Vistula opposite to Kazimierz Dolny, the commune has unique landscape assets. It belongs to the Kazimierz Landscape Park. The commune's seat – Janowiec, formerly a town, today a village – is situated by the river Plewka.

Janowiec's buildings form a narrow strip along the Vistula escarpment. Such a pattern is conditioned on the close proximity of floodlands, which are located on the southern side. The ruins of a castle from the early 16th Century tower over the area. It was once a residence of the Firlejs and the Lubomirskis.

The scenic landscapes of the Małopolska Vistula Gorge, the rich cultural package, the many hiking and bicycle trails, and the closeness of the favourite town of artists – Kazimierz Dolny – attract many tourists. We will find interesting accommodation (including spending the night in a manor or castle!) and restaurant facilities (the inns have excellent local cuisine on their menus).

History:

- The first settlements in the area were 3.5 thousand years ago.
- Serokomla village was purchased by the Firlej Family, which had the Lewart coat of arms.
- In the early 16th Century Mikołaj Firlej started the construction of a castle on a steep slope.
- In 1537 Piotr Firlej established here a town on Magdeburg Law, changing the name to Janowiec.
- The town lost its charter after the fall of the January Uprising.

Places to see and visit in Janowiec:



For history buffs:

- **The Castle** – the construction of this Renaissance structure started at the beginning of the 16th Century, founded by Mikołaj Firlej on the base of the defensive complex of the previous owners of the village, the Janowski family with the Syrokomla coat of arms. The residence was extended until the 18th Century with the participation of the Italian architect Santi Gucci, using local limestone and brick. The last private owner of the castle was Leon Kozłowski, who in 1975 transferred the stronghold to the Nadwiślańskie Museum in Kazimierz Dolny. The renovated northern building houses a hotel in which you may stay for the night. The ruins of Janowiec castle are surrounded by many legends, and there are numerous versions of the tale of the Black Lady. A knight's tournament is held here for the "Ring of the Black Lady" (below a picture).

- **A wooden barn** – in the 19th Century it was moved from the Wylągi. Concerts and theatre performances are organised here.
- **A storeroom** – from the late 19th Century moved from Kurów village.





- **The Manor in Moniaki** – a wooden manor with a mansard shingled roof built in the 18th Century in the village of Moniaki near Urzędów, rebuilt in 1909 according to the design of Kazimierz Skórewicz (1866-1950), a prominent Polish architect. Moved to Janowiec in 1977, the open exhibition comprises six rooms on the ground floor – the hall, dining room and living room, the room of the Lady of the House, the library, and the room of the Master of the House. Other rooms feature the museum’s offices, and guest rooms are located in the attic.



For architecture buffs:

- **The Church of St. Stanislaus the Bishop and St. Margaret** – constructed in the years 1537-1559, founded by Piotr Firley on the walls of a 14th Century Gothic church, rebuilt in the years 1585-1600 according to Santi Gucci’s design, and then in the Renaissance style by Jakub Balin. The most valuable historic item of the church’s interior is the Manneristic tombstone of Andrzej Firley and his wife Barbara – the work of Gucci, who was not only an architect, but also a sculptor. In front of the church there is a monument commemorating the local victims of WW2. Organ concerts are held here in the summer.
- **The Granary** – moved in the 1980s to Janowiec from Podlódów upon Wieprz. Built in the 19th Century of solid wood beams. Inside we



can see an ethnographic exhibition, showing folk art, local handicrafts, fishing equipment and souvenirs after rafters.



For nature lovers:

- **The Małopolska Vistula Gorge** – the wonderful panorama of the Małopolska Vistula Gorge stretches out from the Janowiec escarpment (next to picture). Admiring the views you can sit in the shade of an ancient tree near the Manor (see The Manor in Moniaki). Below, we will see Janowiec, the picturesque meadows and fields, and right behind them the twists and turns and islets of the Queen of Polish Rivers.



Nearby attractions:

- **The Quarry in Nasiłów** – there was a stone pit here in the past, and stone was used e.g. to regulate the Vistula's riverbed. Situated on the left bank of the Vistula, it is considered by geologists as the most valuable opening of the layers in between the Cretaceous and the Tertiary. Numerous fossils testify to the diversity of the world of marine organisms that lived in the former sea basin.
- **The Lake in Janowice** – a lake on the river Plewka, the right-bank tributary of the Vistula, surrounded by a forest. Contact: tel. 604 113 446
- **The Ferry crossings**



“**Serokomla**” – a ferry plying between Nasiłów and Bochothnica, and connecting the two banks of the Vistula, and two tourist towns – Janowiec and Kazimierz Dolny.

KAZIMIERZ DOLNY COMMUNE



Kazimierz Dolny Commune – it is located in the area of the Nałęczów Plateau, on the right bank of the Vistula. Its steep slopes, deep ravines, and shaded gorges are overgrown by lush shrubs.

Many rare species of flora and fauna are to be found here.

The town itself is a true tourist “gem.” In 1994, the unique urban-architectural-landscape complex of Kazimierz Dolny was granted Historic Monument Status by the President of Poland.

Due to its natural and cultural values, the area of the entire commune has been declared a protected area, and on 27 april 1979 the Kazimierz Landscape Park was established here, as the first in the Lubelskie Province.

History:

- In the Middle Ages there was a settlement here called Wietrzna Góra (Windy Hill).
- The town enjoyed its “golden age” in the second half of the 16th Century thanks to rapidly-developing grains trade along the Vistula to Gdańsk.
- The Swedish Deluge, the Northern War, fires, floods, and epidemics brought Kazimierz’s glory to a close. The time of the partitions only contributed to further stagnation.
- At the end of the 19th Century, Kazimierz Dolny became a health resort. Villas and boarding houses started to be built, primarily for vacationers coming from Lublin and Warsaw.
- Almost all towns and villages in the area of today’s commune date back to the Middle Ages.

Places to see and visit in Kazimierz Dolny:



For history buffs:



The Castle – the original 14th Century edifice was oval-shaped (65x30m). At the beginning of the 15th Century a three-storey residential wing was erected. The modernisation of the stronghold took place in the 16th Century. During the Swedish Deluge and the subsequent wars, the castle was destroyed. Today it is used by tourists as a beauty spot.

The Keep – the oldest preserved building in Kazimierz, erected in the 13th Century.



- **The Reformers Monastery Complex** – The Church of the Blessed Virgin Mary and the Reformers Monastery. The temple retained its original décor, featuring the altar with the miraculous painting of the Annunciation of the Blessed Virgin Mary from 1600.
- **The Market Square** (page 6) – it assumed its present form in the 16th Century. The remaining tenement houses testify to the wealth of the Kazimierz burghers of the time.
- **The Museum of Goldsmithery** – the only one in Poland, it was opened in 1979. It collects items of old and contemporary goldsmithery. The impressive collection features about 1,800 exhibits.

- **The Jewish Cemetery** – situated in the forest on ul. Czerniawy. Established in 1851, it was devastated by Germans during the occupation. The remains of the gravestones were built into the monument commemorating the tragic history of Kazimierz’s Jews.





For architecture buffs:

- **St. Bartholomew's and St. John the Baptist's Parish Church** – it was built in the Gothic style in the 14th Century. Its present appearance resulted from its rebuilding at the turn of the 17th Century in the "Lublin Renaissance" style. It houses the oldest fully-preserved parish organ from 1620. The interior catches the attention with a stone baptismal font, the work of a sculptor – Santi Gucci of Florence, the rococo confessionals, and the 17th Century deer-head chandelier.



- **The Przybyło Tenement Houses** – some of the most famous tenements in Poland, built in the Mannerist style around 1615 by the brothers Mikołaj and Krzysztof Przybyło.



The Celej Tenement House – a Renaissance burgher tenement house built by a Kazimierz merchant, Bartłomiej Celej. You can visit the permanent painting, graphic design and drawing exhibition.

- **Granaries** – constructed towards the end of the 16th Century, and in the middle of the 17th Century, in the town's glorious age. They were erected over the banks of the Vistula, near the merchant harbour. There were over 60, and only a few made it to present day. The best recognised granary – the Ulanowskis and Przybyłos Granary houses the Museum of Nature.

For literature buffs:

- **Maria Kuncewiczowa's House** – built in 1936 for the writer and her husband, and designed by Karol Siciński. The villa currently houses a branch of the Nadwiślańskie Museum.

- **Cruises on the Vistula** – for individual tourists and groups. Boats ply all day between April and October. Contact: tel. (81) 881 01 35
- **The Hill of Three Crosses** – a beauty spot on the Kazimierz and the Małopolska Vistula Gor-



ge. The Crosses, which are a reference to the ones on Golgotha, were put in place in 1708 to commemorate the several hundred victims of the plague that scourged the town.

Gorges – strolling along the picturesque bed of loess gorges will provide unforgettable experiences; the most interesting gorges are Korzeniowy Dół, Granicznik, Kamienny Dół, Norowy Dół, and Małachowski.



Nearby attractions:

- **Bochotnica** – the remains of “Esterka’s Castle,” a former stronghold from the 14th Century and the ruins of a Renaissance chapel-mausoleum of Jan Oleśnicki.
- **Parchatka** – a beauty spot. The Three Crosses, founded by Izabella Czartoryska, stood on the hill until the 1940s, and were then put in place again in 2006. Nowadays, it attracts tourists with its ski run.
- **Mięćmierz** – an old rafters’ settlement by the Vistula, today a living ethnographical museum with a windmill and old cottages.



Park Linowy Kazimierz (Ropes Course) – located in the hotel park complex, it features three overground courses.

NAŁĘCZÓW COMMUNE



Nałęczów Commune – situated in the Puławy District in the Nałęczów Plateau, it is an urban and rural commune. The lie of the land is dominated by hills, which surround the Bystra valley with its tributary – the Bochotniczanka. On the calcareous soil of the Nałęczów Plateau lies a thick layer of loess covered with a dense network of gorges.

The heart of the commune is Nałęczów, the only health resort in Poland dedicated exclusively to cardiac health. Numerous sanatoria and guesthouses guarantee a wide range of medical examinations and treatment. The guests can also make use of health farms, spas, and beauty and massage parlours. The health resort resource is enriched with the healing mineral water known for over 200 years.

The exceptional atmosphere of a charming town, previously known as “the literary colony”, which is the home of many associations and venues for creative work of many artists up to this day, means that Nałęczów cures not only the heart but also the soul.

History:

- The name Nałęczów is derived from the coat of arms of Stanisław Małachowski, who in 1751 purchased the Bochoćnica estate,
- The contemporary coat of arms of Nałęczów is a combination of the ancestral symbols of the Małachowski family – “Nałęcz” and “Pilawa”, borne by S. Małachowski’s wife.
- In 1817 royal chemist Jan Józef Celiński conducted the first chemical analysis of Nałęczów waters, confirming their healing values.
- Many prominent artists, politicians, writers, scientists, and architects frequented the place, with such names as I. J. Paderewski, H. Siemiradzki, Minister J. Beck, H. Sienkiewicz, B. Prus, S. Żeromski, Stanisław Witkiewicz

Places to see and visit in Nałęczów:



For history and nature buffs:

- **Zdrojowy Park (Spa Park)** – founded at the end of the 18th Century by S. Małachowski, redesigned in the 19th Century by popular planner and designer of gardens Walerian Kronenberg. The park, which features historic trees, encourages the visitor to go for walks, regardless of the season and weather.



- **Dom Zdrojowy (Spa House)** – an unquestionable attraction inside the palm house and pump room are murals made by a painter Jarosław Olejnicki. There are now three mineral water intakes from the sources of “Celiński”, “Miłość” (Love) and “Barbara” borehole.

- **Małachowski Palace** (page 10) – built in the 18th Century by order of S. Małachowski, the residence, designed by Ferdinand Nax, was rebuilt twice – in the 19th and 20th Centuries.



Stare Łazienki (Old Baths) – previously known as Łazienki Żelaziste (Ferruginous Baths) – constructed in 1817-1820, extended at the end of the 19th Century, burnt down during World War II, and renovated in the 1960’s.



- **Wzgórze Kościelne (Church Hill)** – 18th Century St. John the Baptist’s Parish Church and an adjoining cemetery founded in the 19th Century.



Sanatorium Książę Józef (Prince Joseph) – an old institution connected with hydrotherapy, one of the oldest buildings in the park area, rebuilt in 1882 by Karol Kozłowski.



For architecture buffs:

- **Chapel of St. Charles Borromeo** – built in 1917 in the Zakopane style, founded by Ludwika Benni to commemorate her spouse Karol.



- **Historic houses** – founded at the turn of the 20th Century, and situated along the main streets: Lipowa and Armatnia Góra.
- **Ochronka ("Charity Nursery School")** – founded by Stefan Żeromski, built in 1907 according to the design of Jan Koszyc-Witkiewicz in the Zakopane style. In accordance with the writer's will, the institution was meant to serve the society of Nałęczów.



For history buffs:

- **Stefan Żeromski Museum** (picture) – this wooden "Cottage" is an old summer atelier of the writer. One of the oldest literary museums in Poland (1928), it collection features the authentic furnishings of the atelier. Contact: tel. (81) 501 47 80
- **Bolesław Prus Museum** – The only museum of the writer, founded in 1961 in the rooms on the first floor of Małachowski Palace. Contact: tel. (81) 501 45 52.

The “Jaśminowa” Open-air Gallery of Contemporary Photography – modelled after the Maeght Foundation in Saint-Paul in France, situated on the slope of Chmielewski gorge.

Nearby attractions:

- **Antopol** – an old grange which once belonged to Antoni Małachowski, at the end of the 19th and the beginning of the 20th Century, owned by the Śliwińscy family.
- **Czesławice** – brick stone palace from 1750 and manor park founded around 1886. It is private property now.
- **Sadurki** – a historic station, one of the 24 stations of the Vistula River Railroad running from Eastern Prussia to Kovel in Ukraine.
- **Drzewce** – a manor complex worth seeing.
- **Bronice** – the ruins of a storehouse (an old farm building), situated near a Renaissance manor house and palace, built in classicistic style according to a design by Christian Piotr Aigner.

OPOLE LUBELSKIE COMMUNE



Opole Lubelskie Commune – an urban-rural commune located in the Lubelskie Province in the Opole District. Situated in the southern part of the Chodel Valley, in the Chodelka basin. Areas of unique natural and landscape value have been preserved here. Legal protection followed – in 1990 the Wrzelowiec Landscape Park with the charming valley of the Wrzelowiec Stream was established.

The Chodel Area of Protected Landscape covers the valley of the Chodelka, where forests, open meadows, peat bogs, and fish ponds are home to great numbers of fowl.

The commune's green areas are a dream place not just for nature lovers and people who like active recreation. Lovers of cultural tourism will also find a wealth of historic buildings. Opole Lubelskie is also famous for its trade fair held here since the 14th Century.

History:

- The first mentions of a town bearing a Slavonic name (an old territorial unit) come from the early 14th Century.
- Opole was probably granted the town charter as early as in the turn of the 15th Century.
- In the years 1450 and 1478 King Casimir Jagiellon confirmed the town charter.
- In the 16th Century and the first half of the 17th Century it became a powerful Calvinist centre.
- The town rapidly developed after being transferred into the hands of the Tarlo House in early 18th Century
- It was a flourishing educational centre from the time the Piarists (Order of Poor Clerics Regular of the Mother of God of the Pious Schools) were brought here by the Sandomierz Province Governor Jan Tarlo, and after Ignacy Konarski established the first Polish school of crafts (1761).
- The town was in private hands from the 14th Century to the mid-19th Century.
- In 1941 the Germans established a Jewish ghetto.

Places to see and visit in Opole Lubelskie:



For history buffs and nature lovers:

- **The Town Park** – established in the area of the former Lubomirski family garden in Niezdzów. It was created by the famous gardener and planner W. Kronenberg. It stands out with its diverse trees, and the cultural and entertainment events organised, including Jarmark Opolski (the Opole Lubelskie Fair). The park features an 18th Century Classicist palace. Nowadays it is privately owned, but the park is available to all visitors and is a perfect place for leisure.



- **The Lubomirski Palace** – formerly a castle of the Słupecki family, several times redeveloped, was once a representative lordly residence. Currently the palace houses a General Secondary School.



The Town Watering Place – it is located near the route of the historic narrow-gauge railway. The leisure facility is equipped with pedal boats and canoes.

Cemetery – established in 1772, it is the oldest Polish necropolis located according to the rules of the Enlightenment.



For architecture buffs:

- **The Parish Church with the monastery complex** – The Church of the Annunciation of the Holy Virgin Mary was built in 1675, founded by Jerzy Słupecki, in the Baroque style. It was extended following its acquisition by the Piarists in the 18th Century. Inside the temple there is a valuable polychromy depicting Old-Testament subjects, made at that time by Antoni Dembicki.





Nearby attractions:

- **The Palace in Kluczkowice** – the country residence of Kleniewski family, surrounded by a well-preserved landscape park with monumental sylva. The palace was probably built in the 19th Century, rebuilt in the 1920's. The library was furnished in the style of Zakopane, designed by Stanisław Witkiewicz. Inside the palace there is a museum exhibition. It presents various sections: prehistoric, historical, the history of the narrow-gauge railroad, ethnographic and educational. Contact: tel. (81) 827 10 06. Next to the palace there are fish ponds, and next to the biggest one of these, Staw Młyński (the Mill Pond), there is a leisure resort and a beach.



- **Wrzelowiec Landscape Park** – the park area is 4 988.6 ha. On its grounds we can find dune fields and gorges, where rare species of plants grow. Almost 40% of the park's area is covered by hornbeam-oak forests and pine-oak woods. Its grounds are inhabited by many species of forest animals, such as hazel dormouse, badger and marten, weasel, common polecat. On the so called Kaliszany Islands there is a significant refuge for water and marsh birds.



- **St. Trinity and Madonna of Częstochowa Parish Church in Wrzelowiec** – a classicistic temple built in the years 1777-1784 founded by Zofia Lubomirska. Near the church there is the source of a spring, which constitutes the start to Potok Wrzelowiecki (Wrzelowiecki Creek)

- **St. John of Nepomuk Chapel in Wrzelowiec** – wooden, built at the turn of the 18th and 19th Centuries with the statue of the saint.

- **The Mill in Wola Rudzka** – built of red brick, established between 1908 and 1910. It is located near the earthen levee on the Chodelka river. The mill is currently private property.



- **UFO Monument in Emilcin** – There is an inscription on it: *"On the 10th of May 1978 in Emilcin a UFO landed. The truth will astonish us yet... NAUTILUS Foundation 2005"*

- **The Narrow-Gauge Railway By the Vistula** – is one of the few narrow-gauge railways in the country, and the only one in the Lublin Land that is still active. Its beginnings date back to the late 19th Century. A trip across the picturesque landscape of the Lublin Plateau, the valley of the Chodelka and the Bystra, and the Lublin Land Vistula Riverbank (Powiśle), is a unique tourist attraction. - **The Multimedia Museum** – a contemporary museum documenting the history of Opole Lubelskie and its surroundings. Contact: tel. (81) 475 50 10.

PONIATOWA COMMUNE



Poniatowa Commune – this is a rural and urban commune situated in the eastern part of the Opole District. The town and a part of the commune are located within reach of the Chodel Landscape Protection Area. Although the town itself is an industrial centre, it has kept the natural environment in an unpolluted state. This place is especially attractive for those who value nature, abundant forests and picturesque landscapes. The forests are rich in wildlife – they are admirable during every season of the year. In the spring the ground is covered with beautiful flowers, while in the autumn the abundance of undergrowth draws keen mushroom pickers. They are home to ca. 100 bird species. During a stroll, we can meet woodpeckers, jays, cuckoos, chaffinches, nightingales, orioles, yellowhammers, hawks and buzzards.

Numerous water basins are also an asset of this region, located in the centre of the commune's location. The surrounding ponds are an ideal place for anglers. The commune as an enclave of greenery is conducive to hiking and cycling. The unique microclimate of Poniatowa is used to the advantage of respiratory tracts treatment.

History:

- Poniatowa village belonged to indigent neighbourhood nobility for centuries and existed prior to 1382, as confirmed by the document issued by the Lublin Starost.
- From the mid-15th Century local estates were being taken over by more affluent nobility from other regions.
- Several offshoots of Poniatowski family lived here – among others from the line from which came Stanisław August Poniatowski, the King of Poland.
- In 1937 the construction of Telecommunications Equipment Factory Branch No. 2 was started, which, as part of the Central Industrial Region, was to produce communications equipment for the military. Today's town was formed around the factory.
- After the outbreak of WW2, there were machine repair workshops in Poniatowa, and after that a branch of the Schneider company.
- From November 1941 the Germans established a camp in the area of the factory for ca. 18 000 Russian prisoners, most of whom were murdered.
- In October 1942 in the location of the prison camp and partially in the settlement area a Nazi labour camp was established for ca. 15 thousand Jews.
- After the war, the factory establishments were developed. In 1962 Poniatowa received municipal rights.

Places to see and visit in Poniatowa:



For history buffs:

- **The Pharmacy Memorial Hall** – established by pharmacist Edward Stanek in the building of a modern pharmacy. The unique exhibition is formed by antique furniture from the 1930's – pharmacy equipment (e.g. military field distillation apparatus, tincture extrusion press, water bath, percolator, steam autoclave), and a collection of old professional pharmaceutical literature. Contact: tel. (81) 820 37 07.
- **Memorial to the murdered in the Nazi labour camp** – located in the area of the former "Eda" Electro-mechanical Factory.



For nature and sport buffs:

- **The Valley of the Nine Ponds** – those who seek peace and quiet will find it by strolling by the line of fish ponds cutting through the town, which are ideal for anglers. One can catch here, among others, catfish, pike, carp, tench, bream, sander and crucian. The ponds are looked after by the local circle of the Polish Angling Association.
- **Baths** – for swimming enthusiasts there is an indoor swimming pool and a high-class beach organised along the reservoir in the town centre. It has a separate swimming area and a water area for pedal boats, available for rent. A playground and a paddling pool with slides were created for the youngest. On the beach by the reservoir you can play volleyball on a designated court.
- **The Skatepark** – In 2010 a special track for extreme sports such as skateboarding, BMX riding and professional rollerblading was handed over for use.
- **The "Trail of flavours"** of the Land of Loess Gorges located here also deserves attention.





Nearby attractions:

- **Palace and park complex in Kraczewice** – on a 5 ha area of the park there is an Art Nouveau residence built in the years 1912 – 1914. It was destroyed in the years 1940 – 1983 and was recently restored. In 1988 the “House of Music” was established in the palace, which became the seat of famous children’s art groups “Szczygiełki” and “Scholares Minores Pro Musica Antiqua.” Recently it has become possible to visit the Palace, rent rooms for the night, as well as to organise concerts, outdoor painting and photography workshops, conferences, training, etc. Contact: tel. - **The Sacred Heart of Jesus Church in Kraczewice** – wooden, with a nave and two aisles, built of pine logs in 1920. The church was renovated after WW2. The following items inside the temple deserve attention: the oaken high altar of 1924 with a metal statue of Jesus, on the bolt a painted image of St. Joseph with the Baby Jesus, aisles with paintings of Our Lady of Częstochowa and St. Adalbert – moved from the court chapel in Kowala – stations of the cross carved in wood, and a 1943 organ.

- **The Holy Mary Queen of the World court chapel in Kowala** (below picture) – the chapel is located within the boundary of a 17th Century parcel of land, built of limestone and brick, founded on a rectangular plan, with a semicircular closing in the east. It has a cross-barrel vault with window openings. The roof is pitched and shingled. Inside there is a sculpture of the Madonna made of stone, typical of the 17th Century Poland. Renovated in 1952.

- **Poniatowa Equestrian Centre in Kraczewice Rządowe** (page 17) – an ideal place for every horse-riding hothead and those who wish to start their adventures in horse riding. There are currently more than 20 horses and ponies in the stables. Contact: Chairman tel. 608 506 009, instructor tel. 608 399 006.



PUŁAWY TOWN



Puławy Town – a district town, with a scenic location on the Vistula River, on the borderline of the Lublin Upland and South Masovian Plain. Puławy, together with Nałęczów and Kazimierz Dolny are described as the “tourist triangle.”

The town is unique for its abundance of greenery. At the same time it is a modern and dynamic scientific and industrial centre.

Events, known in the whole country and abroad, such as: the Puławy Nationwide Puppeteer Meetings, the International Jazz Workshops, the International Chamber Music Workshops and the Nationwide Festival of Polish Dance “O pierścień księżnej Izabeli” (“For the ring of Duchess Isabella”) draw thousands of people to Puławy. Additional value is presented by extremely precious historic buildings. Puławy is a garden town with the enchanting, imposing Czartoryski Palace and Park Complex.

History:

- The first settlement was founded at the beginning of the 16th Century and operated a ferry over the Vistula.
- The place was in its golden age under the reign of the Czartoryski family. It became, with Warsaw, the main cultural and political centre in the country – the Polish Athens.
- The end of the golden age of Puławy was brought about by the November Uprising.
- In 1845 by the Resolution of the Administrative Council of the Kingdom the name was changed from Puławy to Nowa Aleksandria, it was restored in 1916.
- In 1906 Nowa Aleksandria received municipal rights.
- The turning point after the turmoil of war was the construction of the Fertiliser Production Plant (Zakłady Azotowe) in 1960, which is when the fast development of Puławy began.

Places to see and visit in Puławy:



For history and nature buffs:

- **Czartoryski Palace** (page 20) – Originally built by the Lubomirski family according to the project of Tylman of Gameren in the years 1627-1679, repeatedly rebuilt. Finally in the years 1785-1810 the palace was given the classicistic look. In one of the chambers on the ground floor of the residence there is the Czartoryski Museum, established in 2009. Czartoryski Park – a garden with an area of 32 ha was founded by the Lubomirski family in the 17th Century – at the end of the next century it was transformed according to the design of a patron of the arts, Princess Izabela Czartoryska, into a landscape park with the help of an English gardener, James Savage. It is an example of a “natural” romantic garden.

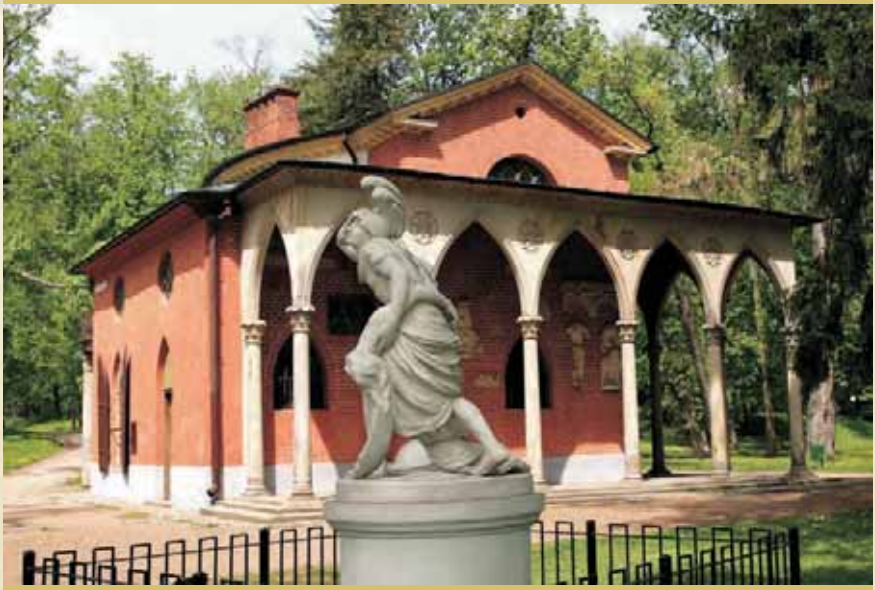
- **The Greek House** – former orangery with a four-column portico. Currently the location of the Town Library.
- **The Museum of Education** – founded in 1987 in the historical building of a former school, built in the beginning of the 19th Century, founded by Izabela Czartoryska. It gathers archives and museum collections in connection with education and the school system, as well as pedagogical work. Contact: tel. (81) 887 71 29.





● **The Temple of Sybil** – the first Polish museum. Built in the years 1798-1801 on the initiative of Princess Izabela Czartoryska after the Temple of Vesta in Tivoli, near Rome. The Princess gathered souvenirs connected with Polish history here.

● **The “Łęg na Kępie” (“Fen on a Holm”) Reserve** – situated in the protection zone of the Kazimierz Landscape Park. Under protection since 1963 it covers an area of 4.71 ha. It forms the protection of riparian forest along the Vistula.



● **The Gothic House** – established in 1809. Originally intended for the foreign museum collection of the Princess, but over time national souvenirs were also gathered here. The first Polish lapidarium was founded here – pieces of architectural and historical monuments were incorporated into the outer walls of the building. There were also exhibitions inside – among the exhibits there was among others the famous Leonardo da Vinci’s “Lady with an Ermine.” Currently the Gothic House and Temple of Sybil is the location of the PTTK Regional Museum. For architecture buffs

● **Marynka Palace** – built in the classicistic style in 1794, according to the project of Ch. P. Aigner. Its name comes from Maria Wirtemberska, the daughter of the princely couple Adam Kazimierz and Izabela Czartoryska, who it was built for.



- **The Sarcophagus** – a symbolic monument of white marble, in memory of August Czartoryski and Zofia nee Sieniawska. It was modelled after one of the oldest-preserved Roman tombs, which belonged to the Scipiones.



- **The Yellow House (Aleksandryjski)** – built at the beginning of the 19th Century in the classicistic style. According to tradition, Tsar Alexander II stayed in it during his visits to Puławy.

- **The Church of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary** – former palace chapel built at the beginning of the 19th Century and modelled after the Pantheon in Rome.

- **St. Joseph's Church in Włostowice** – its construction, according to the architectural design of Franciszek Mayer, was completed in 1728. The founder of this Baroque temple was Elżbieta Sieniawska. The furnishing comes from the end of the 18th Century, founded by the Czartoryski family. In the church cemetery there are Eastern Orthodox and Evangelical gravestones from the 18th Century.



The Chinese Arbor – a park arbor after a Chinese pagoda was built in the middle of the 18th Century.

The Roman Gate – built in 1829 after the Arch of Titus in Rome.



For enthusiasts of contemporary curiosities, and sports buffs:

- **The Astronomical Observatory** – established in a building adapted specifically for this purpose after a former water tower. Contact: tel. (81) 886 49 68.

PUŁAWY COMMUNE



Puławy Commune – a rural commune in the Puławy district. It is situated on both sides of the Vistula River. It is characterised by exceptional natural and scenic values. Here we can find natural lakes, and former flood waters of the Vistula: Nur, Borowiec and Matygi, the surroundings of which are the habitat of numerous bird species: western marsh harrier, common snipe, common moorhen and corncrake. In the area of the commune there is also the "Czapliniec" fauna reserve, protecting a breeding colony of grey heron.

The area of the commune not only enchants you with the beauty of nature, but also with unique monuments, which reflect its rich past. The northern boundary of the commune is defined by the Wieprz River.

History:

- Gołab and Góra Puławska were situated under the Sieciechów castellany until the 14th Century.
- The beginnings of Góra Puławska go back to the turn of the 16th Century.
- During the Swedish Deluge in 1656, near Gołab there was a skirmish between the forces of King Charles X Gustav of Sweden and the units of Stefan Czarniecki (faithful to Jan Kazimierz)
- After the Sieciechów castellany was liquidated, until 1972 Gołab and Góra Puławska were separate administrative units.
- The Puławy commune was established in 1973 as a result of the combination of communal national councils in Gołab and Góra Puławska.

Places to see and visit:



For architecture buffs:



St. Florian and St. Catherine Parish in Gołab

– built in the years 1628-1636 of red brick, in the style of so-called Dutch mannerism. Inside, among others: pulpit from the 17th Century and a baptismal font from 1598. In the main altar there are paintings of the Madonna Crowned by Angels (the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary) and the Sacred Heart of Jesus. In the alcoves there are statues of saints, brought here from the Loreto House.

- **The Our Lady of Loreto Chapel in Gołab** – Loreto House, a copy of the Holy House of Loreto in Italy. Founded by Jerzy Ossoliński, who in 1633 made a pilgrimage there and vowed to erect a similar building on native soil. This unique structure was built ca. 1634.





● **The St. John of Nepomuk statue in Gołęb** – 18th Century stone statue of St. John is a figure bent in a classical contrapposto holding a cross. The saint is dressed in mystically blown clothes.

● **Góra Puławska Parish Church** – the St. Adalbert temple erected in 1781 in Baroque-Classical style founded by August Czartoryski, designed by Jan Kotelniecki.



For history buffs:

● **The German war cemetery in Polesie** – the only such necropolis in the Lublin region, cultivated by young people from all Europe. On the area of 3 ha there are remains of 20 thousand soldiers who died in the east of Poland in the time of WW2. The cemetery was opened in 2000 on the initiative of the German War Graves Commission in the years 1996-2000. Commemoration of the fallen is preserved by stone headstones with their names. They are accompanied by a moving motto located by the entrance: "The dead of all wars call for peace."



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● **The local nature trails deserve attention** – e.g. "Nury Lake" and "Piskory Lake."



For enthusiasts of contemporary curiosities:



The Museum of Unusual Bikes – the only one of its kind in Europe, honoured, among others by the "Perełka Lubelszczyzny" ("the Little Pearl of the Lublin Region") certificate. One can see and test unusual bikes designed and constructed by the owner and curator. The owner also presents tourists with the **Museum of Drinking**. A collection of bottles from around the world – over a thousand exhibits – bottles, tankards, glasses, openers, corkscrews and other accessories. Address: ul. Puławska 1, 24-100 Gołęb near Puławy. WAŹWOLNICA COMMUNE



WaŹwolnica Commune – a rural commune situated in the Puławy District, on the Nałęczów Plateau on the Bystra River Valley. The majority of the commune’s area lies within the Kazimierz Landscape Park and its protection zone. The thickness of the loess layer exceeds 20 m in places, which is conducive to erosion, and has resulted in the richness of the features of the landscape. The area, abounding in diverse landscapes, silence and fresh air is a perfect place to enjoy agritourism.

This place is famous for weekly fairs (Wednesdays), a privilege granted by Władysław II Jagiełło, which have been held continuously since the 15th Century.

WaŹwolnica is also well known as the place of worship of Our Lady of Kębło, attracting pilgrims from the whole Poland and abroad. You can see that during the church fete which is held on the first Sunday of September.

History:

- Krakus is considered to be the founder of "Wawelnica"
- The first written source providing information about the existence of Wąwolnica is an 11th Century Benedictine manuscript.
- Casimir The Great granted municipal rights to Wąwolnica, surrounded it with the walls and built a castle.
- The town was burnt to the ground in the middle of the 16th Century and King Sigismund Augustus ordered to found it again in 1567.
- The 17th Century wars led Wąwolnica to its fall, and the loss of town status after the January Uprising in the 19th Century.
- During WW2 a German ghetto for the Jewish people was located there
- The "pacification" of Wąwolnica by the officers of the Ministry of Public Security took place on 2 May 1946; the town was burnt down, and all the belongings of 197 families were destroyed in reprisal for support given to the residents of the independence underground.

Places to see and visit in Wąwolnica:



For history buffs:

- **St. Adalbert's Church** – built in 1907-1914 in the late neo-Gothic style, raised to the status of a Minor Basilica in 2001. Inside there is a Gothic figure of the Madonna and the Infant Jesus from the 14th Century, made of linden wood.
- **The Chapel of Our Lady of Kębło** – this rebuilt presbytery of an old Gothic church fell into a state of ruin and was pulled down. Nowadays, it is the Sanctuary of Our Lady inside of which there rests the benevolent figure of Our Lady of Kębło. The sculpture is classified as belonging to the series of Beautiful Madonnas and dates back to the middle of the 15th Century. There is the Regional Museum in the Chapel which presents the history of Wąwolnica. Contact: tel. (81) 882 50 04.



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Organistówka – the building of an old parish hospital from the turn of the 19th Century, which was also a refuge for the poor.

Market Square – marked out in the 16th Century, it constitutes the centre of the old town's spatial arrangement.

Cemetery – founded in the mid-19th Century. Worthy of note are tombs furrowed in the slopes.





Nearby attractions:

- **The park and palace complex in Kębło** – a brick stone manor built in the 19th Century, rebuilt at the end of the century by the Rostworowski family. At present a Special Purpose School and an Education Centre with a Riding School are located there.



- **The Chapel in Kębło** – a wooden church built in the place of the revelation of Our Lady during the Tartar Invasion in 1278. The miraculous figure of Our Lady was moved to Wąwolnica in 1700 and the Church was pulled down. In the 19th Century a chapel with the stone on which revelations were granted was built here. The Contemporary Chapel was built in 2008.
- **The park and palace complex in Celejów** – it is a former residence of the Chotecki family from the 15th Century. Rebuilt many times. At the end of the 19th Century it was reconstructed after a fire. Now an Independent Public Healthcare Centre for the Neurotic and Mentally Ill.
- **The ruins of the paper mill in Celejów** – it was built by the Czartoryski family in 1828, and is one of the first paper mills in the country. In 1847, due to a shortage of orders, the paper mill was turned into a water mill. After WW2 the mill fell into disrepair. Today the picturesque ruins, along with the nearby pond, are private property.
- **The Mill in Celejów-Ilki** – originating from Witoszyn, the mill was moved around 1900 to Ilki. In 1914 it was burned down by Russian troops, then reconstructed. In 1945 it was once again destroyed – this time by water, later reconstructed. Since 1960 it has been propelled by electricity. Currently the mill provides services for farmers and constitutes a tourist attraction – tourists can participate in a show of grinding grain into flour. Contact: tel. (81) 723 61 97, 607 926 304.
- **The Celejów Ski Run** – it provides two runs, 250 and 300 metres long. Contact: tel. 601 832 001.



Nart-Sport Rąbłów – in the winter this resort features illuminated ski runs. In the summer it invites visitors to take a bath in the pools.

WOJCIECHÓW COMMUNE



Wojciechów Commune – situated in the Lublin District, between Nałęczów and Bełżyce. The Bystra, Czerka and Ciemięga rivers cross its area.

The Bystra valley is a wildlife corridor between the areas of protected landscapes of the Vistula, Bystrzyca, and Wieprz rivers. It has the unique conditions of a valley microclimate. Visitors are lured by the surrounding picturesque gorges and hills. Large areas are occupied by forests covered by rich undergrowth and diverse fauna. The neighbourhood is a quiet and attractive place to relax, with numerous agrotourism farms welcoming the visitors.

The commune hall is famous for its blacksmithing events, such as the Polish Nationwide Blacksmithing Workshops, the Polish Nationwide Blacksmithing Art Fair, and the Polish Nationwide Blacksmith Meetings.

History:

- Settlement in the area dates back to the 8th Century and the oldest information about the existence of Roman-Catholicism to the 14th Century (1328).
- Jan of the Szczekocki family, Castellan of Lublin, is considered to have been the first owner of Wojciechów.
- In the mid-14th Century the building of fortifications was initiated.
- Jan Pilecki established the stronghold with a habitable tower.
- The new freehold owner, Stanisław Spinka, established a Polish Brethren assembly here in 1580.
- In 1632 Paweł Orzechowski built a palace mansion and allocated the tower for farming purposes.
- Repeated changes of owners in the 19th Century and selling out of lands led to the devastation of the buildings. What remains are a solitary tower and a manor house.
- In September 1939 a group of peasants from Wojciechów helped to save the Wawel treasures.
- During Hitler's occupation of Poland Wojciechów was a strong centre of the Home Army (AK) and the Peasants' Battalions (Bataliony Chłopskie)

Places to see and visit in Wojciechów:



For history buffs:

- **Saint Theodore's Church** – the shrine, surrounded by a brick fence, is situated on a small hill amid linden and maple trees. It was erected in 1725. The Late-Baroque style of the temple is evidenced in its furnishing. In the wooden baroque high altar there are pictures of Our Lady of Perpetual

St. Theodore. The altars are decorated with cordovans – dyed hides – densely decorated with embossed, gilded and painted patterns.

- **Cemetery** – established in the first half of the 19th Century, linked with the temple by a splendid chestnut alley. Numerous impressive gravestones can be found here.



The Commune Office Building – formerly a gentry mansion, erected in the second half of the 19th Century. A plaque commemorating the military actions of the Home Army (AK) soldiers is built into the building wall. Contact: tel./fax (81) 517 72 10, 517 76 22.



The Arian Tower (page 30) – built in the first half of the 16th Century, the only Gothic-Renaissance building combining defensive and residential functions in Lubelszczyzna. It owes its name to its proprietors. In 1910 it was handed down to the Society for the Preservation of Historical Monuments. A thorough refit according to a design by Tadeusz Augustynek was definitively completed in the 1970's. Presently the tower houses the Commune Culture Centre, the Blacksmith Museum, the Wojciechów Regional Museum, the Commune Public Library, and the Polish Blacksmiths' Association.



The Blacksmith Museum – situated on the highest floor of the Arian Tower, it was founded in 1993 and is the only museum of this type in Poland so far. It holds a collection of more than a thousand exhibits of blacksmithing art from Poland and abroad. Address: Wojciechów 9, 24-204 Wojciechów. Contact: tel. The Wojciechów Regional Museum – objects of work and everyday use, used by residents in by-gone days, and exhibits documenting the history of Wojciechów, were collected in its interior stylised as a Wojciechów shack from the 1920-30's. - **Manor and park complex in Palikije** – made of brick, surrounded by greenery and ponds, the manor was erected in 1906 on the foundations of a 17th Century palace. Presently, it is private property, closed to visitors.
- **19th Century manor and park complex in Lubki** – a classicistic, wooden manor dating back to the mid-19th Century, situated by the Czerka river.
- **A chapel honouring the murdered in Szczuczki** – a house-shrine built in 1940 on the spot of the tragedy which took place on 1st October 1939 when the Germans murdered and burnt about a hundred men in the local primary school.

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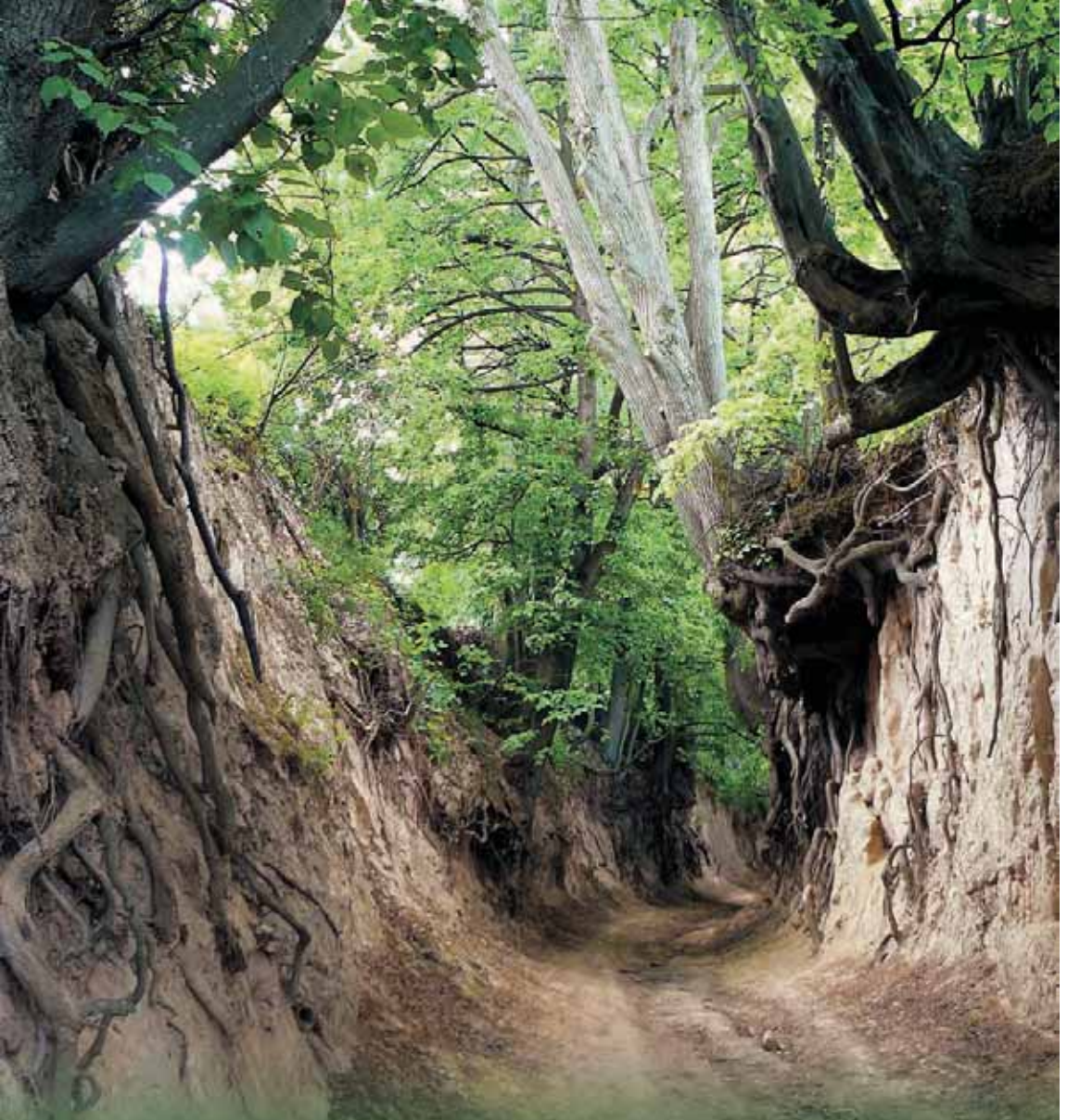
